SAFRAN PRODUCT CYBERSECURITY

Aeronautics, defense and space industries do not accept failure. Whether designed for civil or military purposes, Safran's products and services are continuously guided by the utmost safety and security imperative.

With the threat of cyber-attacks linked to the growing use of new technologies and digital devices, Safran and its customers are compelled to incorporate cybersecurity in the existing safety and reliability commitments at the highest levels of priority. Safran, its personnel and organization, must therefore adapt their answers in an explicit, structured, and efficient way.

As a consequence, our cybersecurity obligation must encompass the following main principles:

- ▶ The cybersecurity requirement must become an omnipresent parameter at each phase of the existence of our products and services: design, development, operation or support. It represents a complement to the Group's imperative quality commitment, and to the classic IT security need.
- ▶ It shall include the full scope of our internal processes and suppliers' systems and equipment, and comply with the existing or future requests from authorities and customers in this matter.
- ▶ And while protecting from potential cyber-attacks, imposing ourselves the utmost security imperative will also constitute a significant competitive added value for our products and services.

And to achieve the highest standards in cybersecurity goals we must adapt our organization:

- ▶ With the implementation of a related organization within each Tier One Company, under the leadership of "Product Security Officers", in charge of identifying the vulnerabilities of supplies, products and services, listing deviations from, or evolutions of the Group's standards, and achieving the related remediation action plans.
- ▶ As well as at the corporate level in charge of coordination and monitoring, a set of directives, standards and KPIs, interface with functions involved, control, training, or crisis exercises.

In the increasingly technological and digitalized world, Safran must be at the top of digital security. It is our common duty to guarantee the safety and security, thus including the cybersecurity, of our products and services to customers and to the public. Each of us shall in this matter, to help the Group progress. I know that I can count on your initiatives, organization, achievements of this Policy, and vigilance.
